



Bylaw Committee Report

On April 1st 2019, a meeting was held at Norwest Access Centre with twenty-eight of our members present to vote on the newly presented bylaws. The vote was unanimous in favor of the document presented, and after twenty five years we now have a new set of organizational rules to aid in the running of MACT.

The bylaws are available on the MACT website and I encourage members to review them as some changes have been made.

In some articles where it made sense to defer to the CSCT bylaws we have done so, for example examinations, matters of discipline and reinstatement policy. These areas are thoroughly covered by the CSCT bylaws so it would have been redundant for us to repeat.

Some of our positions have changed as well. Since we are no longer invigilating the exams the Assistant Education Director has been deleted as the Provincial Education Director's role has been modified to reflect the goals of CSCT.

We have added the position of Registrar to work alongside the Treasurer as there is a great deal of responsibility in this portfolio in its own right.

Webmaster has also been brought forward as we require an individual to provide maintenance to the MACT website.

One of the biggest changes that have been introduced is staggered elections. Going forward, a portion of the Board will be elected every year. The terms will remain the same other than this year, and the rationale was to provide continuity and support for various newly elected directors.

We have also added the recommendation of a standing Bylaw committee so the Bylaws can be kept up to date as they should be reviewed every three to five years.

I would like to thank Colleen Bemister for working with me on the Bylaw committee over the past term. Without her efforts this project would not have been realized.
